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#### **SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS**

#### 1. ANNOUNCEMENT

Motor Sport (North West) Ltd. will organise and promote an Interclub Permit Multi Venue Closed Road Stage Rally on Friday 22nd and Saturday 23rd March 2024. Friday 22nd includes pre-event documentation, scrutineering and ceremonial start. The Event will be known as the Legend Fires North West Stages.

#### 2. AUTHORISATION

Motorsport UK Permit Number 131737.

CAO Authorisation Number will be posted on the Official Notice Board (Sportity).

#### 3. JURISDICTION

The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of Motorsport UK Limited (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organisers may issue for the event. The Rally HQ will be Myerscough College. Pre-event documentation will be posted on the event web site and on the Sportity App.

The Official Notice Board and all official documentation will be accessible on Sportity. There will be no physical notice board at Rally HQ.

When any information is posted to Sportity by the organisers, all competitors will be deemed to have read it. You are therefore advised to enable notifications.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY AND CHAMPIONSHIPS

The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising clubs (listed in paragraph 39) and members of the individual clubs within the ANWCC, ANCC and WAMC.

The event is a qualifying round of the following 2024 Championships:

Probite British Rally Championship (CH2024/RALLY001)

Protyre Motorsport UK National Asphalt Rally Championship (CH2024/RALLY006)

AS Performance North of England Tarmacadam Rally Championship (CH2024/RALLY057)

ANWCC Stage Rally Championship, incorporating the SD34 Challenge (CH2024/040)

ANWCC All-Rounder's Championship (CH2024/039)

ANWCC Ladies Rally Championship (CH2024/043)

ANCC Proflex Shock Absorbers Stage Rally Championship (CH2024/RALLY062)

Driver and Co-driver must each be in possession of a valid Competition Licence and Club Membership Card. These must be uploaded along with all web entry details, including championship registrations if applicable.

All drivers must have completed at least three Interclub (previously National B) Stage Rallies.

Competitors are reminded that when an entry is made in the name of a commercial firm or sponsor the appropriate Entrant's Licence **must** be entered on-line at the time of entry.

#### **5. OVERSEAS ENTRIES**

Entrants from non-UK residents will be permitted. Each crew member must join one of the Motor Clubs listed in Paragraph 39 or be a member of a club which is part of one of the invited associations. Competitors wishing to apply for Motor Club membership should contact the Entries Secretary for club membership options and once joined MUST update the on-line entry.

Competitors from any non-UK country holding a National Competition Licence issued by one of those countries may enter and must provide proof from their ASN that their licence is valid for stage rallies in the role in which they are competing (driver / co-driver) (FIA ISC Article 2.3.7). All competitors are subject to Motorsport UK General Regulations whilst competing (GR H25.2.1).

#### **6. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY**

All vehicles must comply with current Motorsport UK Safety and Technical regulations and in particular R46-48, and where appropriate FIA Technical regulations.

Motorsport UK Competition Car Log Book / Vehicle Passport (R46.1.3), vehicle registration document and where appropriate, a current MOT Certificate (R46.1.2), must be produced at scrutineering. If applicable, valid FIA Homologation Forms must also be provided and made available at Scrutineering.

Non-UK vehicles can be log booked before the start of the rally **by prior arrangement**. Cars must be taxed and insured for use on the public highway.

Sound testing will be carried out in accordance with regulation R4.1.

#### 8. FORMAT AND ROUTE

The event will be based at the Myerscough College, St Michael's Road, Bilsborrow, Preston PR3 ORY, What3words ///going.play.vowed. This will be the location for Rally HQ, scrutineering, signing-on and central servicing. Exact times and locations will be provided in the final instructions.

## PLEASE NOTE THAT THERE WILL BE NO VEHICULAR ACCESS TO THE COLLEGE UNTIL 10:30 HOURS ON FRIDAY 22nd.

The event will contain up to 10 (all closed road) special stages, providing approximately 58 stage miles and 82 road miles. The road sections between stages will be defined by a Tulip Road Book; O.S. Maps 97,102 and 103 cover the area used for the event. All stages will take the form of sealed asphalt roads.

Competitors will be supplied with a Road Book and Time Cards at recce / event signing on, giving all details of the Special Stages and the road sections providing the necessary information in accordance with R33.1.

Should a Stage be unexpectedly cancelled, alternative routes will be included in the back of the Road Book. These will direct you to the next Time Control (Stage Arrival or Service In), along with the time allowance for the routes which should be used to calculate your due time, based on your recorded time of departure from the previous control.

The first Car will be due at MTC 1 on Saturday at 08:41. Road Sections will be timed to the minute and Special Stages to the tenth of a second (R32.2.f ii). The event will run using the Target Timing system as defined in R31 of the General Regulations.

Competitors will start stages at one-minute intervals. The organisers may change the start interval for operational reasons. In accordance with R26.6.2 and as agreed by Motorsport UK the start interval may be 30 seconds. For stages starting at 30 second Intervals, in accordance with R25.8 the 30-second warning will be dispensed with.

Special Stages will be timed manually in parallel with the RAB Timing automated system. A jump start will be detected by a beam as per GR R25.7.3. In the event of equipment failure, the start marshal will record any jump starts.

A traffic light system will be used to signal the start of the Stage (R25.7.2), for both methods. The traffic light sequence is as follows:

Start Interval (e.g. 1 minute) Red light

5 seconds Red light is extinguished

Amber clusters count down 5-4-3-2-1

O seconds Green light – Go

As per 2024 Motorsport UK Year Book R30.1.3. - at all Controls, the Time Card is to be completed manually by a Marshal.

#### 9. CLASSES

Vehicles with forced induction will have their engine capacity increased by 70% to establish their class (J5.4.1). Rotary engine vehicles will be subject to the equivalency factor as per R48.2.4(a). There will be no Class for electric cars.

Competitors winning overall awards will not be eligible for class awards.

Awards will be presented at The Stumble Inn, Myerscough College, immediately after the event. The Stumble Inn will be open from 3pm on Saturday.

#### 11. ENTRIES

Only experienced drivers may enter this event. The driver must have finished a minimum of three National B / Interclub Special Stage Rallies to be eligible for an entry. **Please ensure you have entered details of at least three rallies that the driver has finished** on the seeding part of the Entry Form. These results will be verified.

The maximum entry for the meeting is 130 plus reserves. The minimum entry is 100. The minimum entry for each class is 4. Should any of the above figures not be reached, the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting, reduce the stage mileage, or amalgamate classes as necessary.

The entry list opens on Thursday 1st February 2024 at 19:00 hours and closes on Thursday 29th February at 19:00 hours. However, if the maximum number of entries has not been

reached, the organisers reserve the right to accept entries up to Thursday 7th March. Entries received after 29th February may not be seeded but may appear on the entry list.

Entries must be made online via the event web site www.northweststages.co.uk or www.rallies.info with all mandatory fields completed.

Entries will be acknowledged but that will not indicate acceptance of the entry.

When an entry is acknowledged an email will be sent notifying the entrants that payment is required.

20 entries will be reserved for Probite British Rally Championship contenders and 20 entries for Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship Contenders for a period of 24 hours from entries opening. **CHAMPIONSHIP REGISTRATION DETAILS MUST BE PROVIDED AT TIME OF ENTRY AND WILL BE VERIFIED AGAINST CHAMPIONSHIP ORGANISER RECORDS.** 

25 places will be allocated at the organisers' discretion. All remaining entries will be accepted in order of receipt of PAID entry with fully completed entry form. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.

The entry fee is £895 which includes the costs of trackers and a payment to local carbon offsetting projects.

All entries must be made by electronic entry form with payment by electronic bank transfer as detailed below, please quote the driver's name as reference.

The entry fee includes one Service Pass for a service vehicle. However additional service space is available as follows:

- Standard Service Pitch, 6 x 7 metres (for a Sprinter/Transit type Vanand rally car) included in entry fee
- Large Service Pitch 10 x 7 metres (includes one additional vehicle / caravan pass) @ £100
- Super Service Pitch 100 Square metres (for HGV type service vehicles/ awning / motorhome) @ £200

Pitch sizes are approximate. All non-standard pitches / additional vehicle passes are subject to space availability and will be allocated on first come first served basis. Additional Service space must be requested on the entry form in order that availability can be checked.

Please note, service passes do not allow use for overnight sleeping accommodation.

Entry Fees will be refunded to withdrawn entries as follows, provided written or email confirmation of such is received by the Entries Secretary:

Competitors will be seeded by reference to information given on the entry form. The Organisers will **not** enter into any negotiation regarding seeding or entry.

#### 12. CANCELLATION / POSTPONEMENT

If the event is cancelled, or postponed for more than 24 hours, the organisers reserve the right to retain a proportion of the entry fee to cover any costs incurred. The Organisers will not be liable for any consequential losses incurred by prospective competitors because of event cancellation or postponement (D29,1.1).

#### 14. TIMING AND PENALTIES

Marking, Penalties, Timing and other regulations will be as Motorsport UK General Regulations as published in the 2024 Motorsport UK Year Book, except for the following, which are modified:

- R24.7 Judges of Fact will be appointed to adjudicate on R24.7.2, 24.7.3, 24.7.5, 24.7.6, 24.7.7, 24.7.8, 24.7.9, 24.7.10, R25.8.2, R32.2 (b), (c), (d) and (e). A list of the Judges of Fact will be posted on the official notice board.
- R24.8 Judges of Fact will also act as Driving Standards Observers and judge on R24.8.1 R24.8.3.
- R24.9.1 Judges of Fact and/or DSO's will be appointed to report on sound levels. Excessive sound will include instantaneous occurrence of noise such as that produced by backfiring caused by anti-lag systems. The penalty for excessive sound may go as far as disqualification.
- R31.2.5 The maximum cumulative lateness between Main Controls is 15 minutes.
- R31.2.6 Cumulative lateness is penalty free up to 15 minutes.
- R32.2(a) Not reporting or reporting OTL at a Control -15 minutes plus stage maximum per stage See Note1
- R32.2(h) Lateness penalties will not be applied except at Service (out) controls.
- R40.1 To be classified as a finisher, a competitor must complete two-thirds of the stages and report to the final control within the maximum lateness specified, with the car in which they started, and must hand in a completed damage declaration form.

#### Note<sup>1</sup>

Competitors wishing to re-join the event after missing a control and / or stage may only restart at the next Main Time Control. They will need agreement from the Clerk of the Course (based in Rally HQ) who will provide a re-start time and the Clerk of the Course may also require the car to be re-scrutineered.

### COMPETITORS ARE REMINDED OF THE 2024 YEAR BOOK CHANGES IN RESPECT OF READINESS TO START A STAGE.

R30.2.3. Competitors must not leave the Special Stage Arrival Control unless ready to start a Special Stage.

R32.2(d) Not attempting or being ready to attempt a stage when instructed to do so

1st Offence - 10 minutes 2nd Offence - Disqualification

R32.2(e) Making a false start at a special stage

1st Offence – 10 seconds (plus actual false start time)

2nd Offence - 1 minute 3rd Offence - 3 minutes

Further Offences – at the Clerk of the Course's discretion

#### 15. SMOKING POLICY

Myerscough College is a no-smoking campus, other than the one designated smoking area at the back of the Stumble Inn. Please ensure that all personnel associated with your team are fully aware of and adhere to this requirement.

#### **16. SERVICING**

Central servicing will be located at Myerscough College, Bilsborrow where one service vehicle per competing car will be permitted plus any additional vehicles with passes purchased in accordance with fees in paragraph 10 above.

Competitors will be required to provide and use an oil-proof sheet under their car during service. There will be a strict 10mph speed limit in the grounds of Myerscough College.

Service vehicles may not leave the main service area during the event except in the case of retirement by the competing car.

All competitors will be issued with one Service Plate per competing car which must be displayed at all times. Failure to do so will incur the disqualification of the associated competing vehicle.

There will be no auxiliary service/management vehicles permitted. For the avoidance of doubt, organised assistance is not permitted anywhere other than the Myerscough main service area, including as per R38.1.2, "In any area where Service is not permitted, the presence of service crew, or any vehicle from which equipment or parts are supplied or obtained, or the setting up or the collection or the use of equipment previously deposited, will be considered to be servicing."

The Motorsport UK safety requirements now include guidelines for service areas and service crews. These requirements are included on the Motorsport UK web site. Please make sure that you comply with these and that your service crew is fully aware of, familiar with and adheres to the safety recommendations.

Competitors are responsible for ensuring that their service crews understand and comply with all regulations and the service area safety recommendations, R38.3 applies.

Competitors in contravention of R38 will be penalised as per R32.2 Chart 32.2 (n) and (o) subject to the following modifications:

- Presence of a service vehicle in any area where servicing is not permitted DISQUALIFICATION
- Organised assistance anywhere other than permitted areas DISQUALIFICATION

#### 17. RE-FUELLING

Competitors may use Pump Fuel as defined in the 2024 Motorsport UK Yearbook Nomenclature and Definitions. Where competitors entered in a championship that has not specified the use of FIA specification fuel, the use of such fuel might affect their championship eligibility.

Competitors may only refuel in areas, not being road sections, specifically designated by the organisers or by using commercially available pump fuel dispensed directly from pumps at filling stations on the rally route. R38.1.5 applies. No one must be within the vehicle for example driver, navigator, service crew, and the engine must be stopped throughout any refuelling operation. **Penalty for Breach of R38.1.5 is disqualification and reported to Motorsport UK.** 

There will be NO refuelling permitted within the main service area other than the designated refuel zone. Any fuel taken on route must be from pumps at filling stations – filling stations will be noted in the Road Book. At Myerscough, a refuelling area will be set up and managed by Motorsport UK Environmental Inspectors. All refuelling will be self-refuel.

Competitors will be able to refuel their vehicles:

- using their own fuel brought to the event in an appropriate British Standard approved fuel container, or
- using fuel delivered to the venue in an appropriate British Standard approved fuel container by a race fuel supplier prior to the event; deliveries must be pre-agreed with the organisers.

Competitors / Suppliers must deposit their fuel with the Motorsport UK Environmental Inspector in the designated refuel area prior to the end of scrutineering on Friday 22nd. It is not permitted to transport fuel across the service area whilst the rally is in progress. Your fuel canisters will be tagged and logged and released for use to your nominated person(s) only. No one under the age of 17 will be allowed in the refuel zone.

#### Refuel Area Safety Rules:

- 1. Maximum speed limit within zone 5MPH
- 2. Personnel carrying out refuelling must wear appropriate PPE, which includes gloves and long sleeve garments, balaclavas are advisable. No shorts will be permitted
- 3. The responsibility for refuelling is incumbent on the competitor alone
- 4. Refuelling must be either by pump or from MOD/UN specification 20 litre jerry cans with the purpose made flexible metal spouts. **Funnels are NOT permitted.**
- 5. You must only refuel on your way out of service. This will allow your vehicle to cool down prior to refuel
- 6. Engines must be switched off throughout the refuelling process
- 7. No persons must be within the vehicle throughout any refuelling operation

Please note that permission can be obtained to retrieve your fuel canisters during the event if you are forced to retire by asking the permission of the event Motorsport UK Environmental Inspector. They will give clear instructions on how these containers can be collected.

Any competitor found in breach of refuelling area procedures will be subject to the following penalties.

For late deposit of self-refuel canisters and/or moving of fuel canisters around the Service Area during the event, or breach of Refuel Area Safety Rules 1 to 5 or if you are found refuelling in an area other than the refuel Area, the penalties are as follows:

- First Offence Reported to the Clerk of the Course
- · Second Offence Disqualification from the event

For breach of Refuel Area Safety Rules 6 and 7 (R38.1.5):

Disqualification and reported to Motorsport UK

If it is necessary, as part of the service, to change a fuel tank, fuel pump, fuel filter, or any other item of fuel circuit this is NOT PERMITTED in the Service Area. In this case:

- The Service Area Controller must be notified, and they will direct you to a special safety zone for the work to be carried out
- There must be NO sources of ignition taken into the safety zone
- · No other work can be carried out on the car during this operation
- · There must be no one inside the car
- Service personnel, including those standing by, should ensure they are wearing protective clothing, including suitable non-absorbent gloves and eye protection
- · Any removed fuel is placed into a sealed container
- A suitable fire extinguisher with operator must be on standby provided by the competing crew



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#### 18. RESULTS

Interim results will be available at Rally HQ and via the internet. Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the event on the virtual Official Notice Board on the Sportity App. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with C5.1 – C5.7.

#### 19. IDENTIFICATION

Competitors will be identified by: Rally Plates, supplied by the Organisers, to be fixed to the front and rear of the vehicle.

• Official Door Plate to be positioned on each door above the numbers. Competition numbers shall be in accordance with J4 together with:

Competition numbers for each rear side window (or equivalent area on smaller vehicles) which shall be 25cm high with a stroke width of at least 31.5mm, a minimum separation not less than 31.5mm and coloured yellow.

Further in the bottom of the rear screen (or equivalent space on two-seater cars)
the competition number shall be displayed black numbers on a 18cm x 18cm white
background. This number must be visible from the rear of the vehicle at eye level but
must not impede the rear view via the rear view mirror.

In addition, advertising decals supplied by the organisers incorporating publicity for the event must be displayed on each front door of the competing car. Competitors may also be required to carry advertising material supplied by the organisers (H29.1.3.e).

All door numbers must be provided by the Competitor to be fixed in position prior to scrutineering. Door numbers will be available to purchase at the Sound Check. Yellow side-window numbers will be provided by the organisers.

Any previous rally plates must be removed, and any Driver/Co-driver names must accurately reflect the competing crew.

#### **20. REIS MOTORSPORT INSURANCE**

The Organisers have applied to Reis for a Blanket Cover Note under the above scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event.

All applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Reis Motorsport Declaration: -

Vehicles must have a valid motor insurance policy which provides as a minimum, Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can be either, by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or, by purchasing additional cover, providing under the Event Road Section Scheme as an adjunct to an existing motor policy. If a competitor has an extension to their existing policy, they will be required to sign a declaration that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.

If a competitor wishes to purchase additional Road Section cover via the organisers then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following:

- · is aged 19 years or older
- has held a full UK / EU driving licence for a minimum of 6 months OK
- · has no more than 6 conviction points on their licence and no bans of any kind OK
- · has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years
- do not have the Third-Party Extension cover on their existing motor policy
- the vehicle has a valid MOT and taxed for the road, unless exempt from doing so

Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their codriver be a more senior member of their family or over 25. Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed price, if approval from the Appointed Insurance Broker has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event. Approval can be sought by Event Organisers sending an email to the contact@ reis.co.uk and provide the Drivers' name and date of birth, the date they passed their driving test and full details of any motoring claims and/or convictions.

Additional cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser(s). Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event.

#### 21. RECONNAISSANCE

- 21.1 Subjective Route Notes. Competitors may make their own subjective route notes or purchase a choice of notes and associated DVD of the stages (R25.9) from the event's nominated supplier(s), Onthepacenote UK or Patterson Pacenotes. In all circumstances, competitors are advised that the organisers accept no liability or responsibility in the use of subjective route notes. Subjective Route Notes may only be purchased direct from Onthepacenote UK https://onthepacenote.co.uk/ or Patterson Pacenotes https://www.rallynews.net/pattersonpacenotes/index.asp and no other supplier.
- 21.2 Each crew will be permitted two familiarisation passes of each closed road stage venue. There will be 2 sessions to choose from. Group 1, Saturday 16th March between 08:30 and 17:00, and Group 2, Friday 22nd March between 08:30 and 17:00. For clarity, the closed road stage venues will all be used more than once on the event, however, only two

familiarisation passes are allowed per venue.

- **21.3** Any competitor found on any Special Stage outside these timed sessions will not be allowed to start the Rally. Traffic on Special Stages before Friday 16th March 2024 will be regularly checked by the Police and the Organisers. Any competitor who resides on or adjacent to a Special Stage or is required to drive on a Special Stage for business purposes must notify the organisers in writing in advance.
- **21.4** Competitors must register with the organisers the details of the car which they will be using for the familiarisation passes. Registration of vehicles and drivers, and familiarisation pass identification will be issued at a time and location to be advised in the Final Instructions.
- **21.5** Identification supplied by the event must be displayed clearly on the side windows during reconnaissance.
- **21.6** Any Competitor found on a Special Stage without having registered as above, or in breach of these regulations, will not be permitted to start the rally, reported to Motorsport UK and their entry fee will not be refunded. This will be strictly enforced.
- **21.7** During the reconnaissance period there will be a 30mph speed limit on all Special Stage roads unless a lower limit is indicated by a written instruction issued by the Organisers. The police and organisers will arrange speed checks and general patrols of the Special Stages and roads used during this period.
- **21.8** Competitors, entrants or others found in cars exceeding speed limits, driving or being driven at an excessive speed or in any way which in the opinion of the organisers causes or could cause danger or inconvenience to other road users or local residents or maybe considered as bringing the sport into disrepute will be reported to the Clerk of the Course and penalised as follows:

First offence - £300 fine Second offence - Refused Start

- **21.9** The Organisers will issue a list of Special Stages, speed limits and supplementary instructions which will apply during the reconnaissance period and which will have the same force as these Regulations.
- **21.10** The Organisers will appoint Judges of Fact to adjudicate on these specific regulations, but the decision of the Clerk of the Course will be final. Such decisions will be made irrespective of whether or not Police action is taken and irrespective of the outcome of such an action. There is no right of protest or appeal and entry fees will not be refunded.
- **21.11** Only standard road cars may be used for reconnaissance. Modified wheels are permitted, roll cages are not permitted and advertising may not be carried on cars used

for reconnaissance. If there is any dispute as to whether a car is standard, it must be presented for scrutiny to the organisers in advance. The decision of the organisers will be final. Any entrant, competitor or others found using a car in breach of this regulation will not be permitted to start the rally. The organisers reserve the right to not allow the use of any particular car.

**21.12** The use of intercoms and headsets during the familiarisation passes is not permitted, unless a letter of medical dispensation from Motorsport UK is produced at signing on.

**21.13** Any entrant, competitor or competition licence holder who practices, reconnoitres, or causes any person to do so on their behalf in breach of these SRs will incur the penalty of disqualification against which there is no right of protest or appeal.

#### 22. TIMING CHIPS/TRANSPONDERS

To improve results accuracy and to enable automated timing, we will be operating a timing system that includes in-car tags/transponders and trackside readers. Tags will be fitted at scrutineering and will be removed at the end of the event. Any car retiring must return the tag to rally HQ, any competitor not returning the tag at the end of the event will be charged £10.

#### 23. TRACKERS - SUPPLY, FITTING AND RETURN

#### 23.1 TRACKER FITTING

Tracker units will be provided as part of the entry fee and can be fitted by the supplier, Geotraq, between sound check and scrutineering on Friday 22nd March. Competitors / service Crews will be encouraged to be involved in the fitting, so they are familiar with how it is done in order to facilitate the subsequent removal at the end of the event.

The Tracker is fitted by means of a bracket which is tightened around the roll cage on the co-driver's side of the vehicle. A USB-C connection wire is connected to the device which is linked to a remote SOS button. This wire will be tie-wrapped to the roll cage and the remote SOS button attached to the Driver's door panel or Driver's side roll cage using velcro or similar. There is no requirement for a 12v feed. All necessary fittings are supplied and can be fixed in place by Geotraq, but competitors / service crews can assist in the attachment of the clamp fitting and the feeding /attaching of the remote SOS wire/button, to ensure it does not interfere with any of the vehicles other cabling and / or fittings and is within reach at all times while belted into the seat.

#### 23.2 TRACKER OPERATION

The Geotraq tracker includes SOS, OK, Hazard and Overtake functions plus the driver has access to a remote SOS button.

All competitors MUST familiarise themselves with the tracker and its operation prior to the event.

#### 23.3 TRACKER RETURN

Trackers, attachments and all cabling will be collected at the holding control prior to MC3. If the competitor does not attend the holding control it is their responsibility to ensure that the tracker, attachments and all cabling are returned to Rally HQ. In accordance with Motorsport UK Stage Rally Safety Requirements non-return of a unit will be treated as per failure to hand in damage declaration (R40.1.3).

#### 24. SOS BOARDS AND TRACKER USE

Competitors are reminded of the requirements when being involved in or coming upon an incident, R25.4, as amended in 2024. References below are 2024 Motorsport UK Yearbook references.

R25.4. Competitors must carry an A4-size white board with a red SOS on one side and black OK on the other (letters to be a minimum of 12cm high with a minimum stroke width of 1.5cm), with means to secure them on display for oncoming competitors.

R25.4.1. In the case of an accident where urgent medical attention is required, the red SOS sign must be displayed as quickly as possible to alert following cars and aid any aircraft attempting to assist. Where present the crew must operate the SOS function on the Tracking Console.

R25.4.2. Any crew that sees a red SOS sign displayed on a car or sees a major accident where both crew members are inside the car but not displaying the SOS sign, must immediately and without exception stop to give assistance. Where present the crew must operate the SOS function on the Tracking Console in their own vehicle and that of the crashed vehicle where accessible.

R25.4.3. All following cars must also stop and the second car arriving at the scene must inform the next radio point.

R25.4.4. Subsequent cars must leave a clear route for emergency vehicles.

R25.4.5. The Clerk of the Course may award a discretionary time to any Competitor delayed in such circumstances.

R25.4.6. Any crew which is able to but fails to comply with the rule will be disqualified following a Judicial Hearing pursuant to Section C and reported to the ASN.

R25.4.7. In the case of an incident where medical intervention is not required, the OK sign must be clearly shown to following vehicles, and to any aircraft attempting to assist. If the crew leave the vehicle, the OK sign must be left clearly visible to other Competitors. Where present the crew must operate the OK function button on the Tracking Console. The Emergency Red Warning Triangle must be placed at least 100m down the stage, appropriate to the approaching speed of following competitors to provide a visible advanced warning. Only if safe to do so, it is recommended that the triangle is placed on the same side of the road as the vehicle.

R25.4.8. Any crew failing to comply will be Disqualified following a Judicial Hearing pursuant to Section C and reported to the ASN.

R25.4.9. Competitors who misuse the SOS or OK signs will be penalised and may be reported to Motorsport UK for further action.

R25.4.10. Where a Tracking System is being used, a competitor encountering a hazard other than described in 25.4.2. must operate the Hazard function on the Tracking Console and await further instructions from officials.

R25.4.11. Competitors who misuse the Hazard function will be Disqualified following a Judicial Hearing pursuant to Section C and reported to the ASN for further action. R25.4.12. A 'hazard' is defined as any situation or incident on a Special Stage which is considered to be creating a safety issue that affects the safe passage of Competitors through that Stage.

Any crew which is able but fails to comply with any of the General Regulations relating to Tracking will be disqualified and reported to Motorsport UK.

#### **25. TYRES**

Tyres used must comply with General Regulation L3 and remain road legal at all times. Tyres marked 'for racing purposes only' are not permitted.

As per R48.5.11, the maximum number of tyres permitted will be 12.

In the event of an extreme weather event (defined as: Temperatures over 28c for a 24-hour period), the Clerk of the Course may request the Motorsport UK Steward to suspend the tyre allowance on the grounds of safety.

Where there is significantly heavy rainfall and the Clerk of the Course (of a Sealed surface event and all Single Venue Stage Rallies not covered by a Master Agreement) issues a Bulletin declaring a 'wet' event, the use of wet tyres will be permitted outside of the specified allowance on the grounds of safety.



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



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#### **26. PUNCTURES**

Any competitor continuing to drive on the asphalt with a punctured tyre where the wheel rim is in contact with the asphalt will be liable for the cost of any damage to the surface as this damage is not covered by the usual third-party insurance. For this reason, it is strongly recommended to carry a spare wheel, warning triangle and suitable equipment to complete a wheel change on any terrain. This should be secured in position before scrutineering.

#### 27. ROAD / VERGE DAMAGE

Any competitor seen to be cutting corners and causing damage to grass verges will be liable for the cost of repair. Stage furniture may be used to mark areas where it is necessary to protect verges and limit corner cutting. The correct route on Special Stages uses the sealed surface. Any competitor judged to have intentionally used verges marked in this way as a short cut, will be penalised. (R32.2(c))

#### 28. AVIATION

No person connected with any competing crew, (including service crew) may fly an aircraft or drone at any point on the route of the event (penalties in accordance with R32.2 aa and cc. Drones will only be allowed to be flown by fully accredited Media personnel who have been authorised by the Media Manager following consultation with the Clerk of the Course and Safety Officer.

#### 29. DAMAGE DECLARATION

At the conclusion of the competition Competitors must sign a declaration form confirming that they have not been involved in any incident which may have resulted in damage to property or injury to persons or animals, or alternatively give details of any such incident. Failure to comply will be penalised in accordance with R32.2 (disqualification) and may be reported to Motorsport UK for further disciplinary action (R40.1.3).

Competitors who retire from the event must complete and return the form within 72 hours of the finish of the event. Failure to do so may be penalised with a fine of up to £100 (R40.1.4).

Competitors causing damage to any third-party property will be liable for any excess the organisers have to pay to the Motorsport UK insurers and also any cost that is not covered by the Insurers. The excess is currently £450.

Stage commanders will be checking, and reporting to the Event Safety Officer, any incidents which could have led to third party damage. Eyewitness reports, photo or video evidence may also be used to ensure that any damage to third party property is accurately reported.

#### **30. HEALTH AND SAFETY**

All entrants must ensure that all persons connected with their entry have read and understood the following statement: 'Every person participating in this event, whether employed or voluntary, shall take reasonable care for health and safety of themselves or other people who may be affected by his / her acts or omissions during the operation of the event.'

#### 31. RED FLAG

In accordance with R24.4.5, on any Special Stage where extreme circumstances make it necessary to authorise the movement of non-competing or rescue vehicles prior to the Special Stage being cleared of competing cars, the Red Flag system will be in place. Red Flags will be located at all mandatory radio points and at mid stage rescue points and other in-stage radio locations. Red Flags will only be displayed on the specific instruction of the Clerk of the Course or one of his deputies or the Stage Commander via the Radio Controller and will only be deployed when there is a possibility of non-competing vehicles and rescue vehicles moving on Special Stage AHEAD of competing cars.

Flags will be prominently displayed (held out steady not waved) by a designated marshal who will be wearing a marshal's tabard. In accordance with R25.6.4, on passing a Red Flag, displayed by a marshal wearing a marshals' tabard, the crew MUST immediately and significantly reduce speed as well as being prepared to stop at any time; at no time must they overtake any safety vehicle they encounter on the special stage route. The crew must then follow the instructions of any marshals and/or stage safety personnel and maintain this reduced speed until leaving the special stage. Failure to comply with this rule will result in Disqualification following a Judicial Hearing pursuant to Section C and reported to the ASN.

#### 32. CAMERAS

The use of on-board video cameras is permitted in strict accordance with general regulation J5.21. Cameras must be fitted prior to scrutineering. Footage may be required by the organisers, and in the case of an incident may be required by Motorsport UK and/or the Police should an investigation into an incident be required.

#### **33. PERSONAL DATA**

The organisers will only use your personal information to administer your entry, including providing public Entry and Results Lists, and sending you emails in connection with your entry. Your information will also be used by rallies.info who is providing the event entry system and the results service, and by Pro-Rally Photography, the event Official Photographer. By submitting an entry to this event, you are deemed to have accepted these terms for both crew members.
